The primary goal of the ELECT (Education Leading To Employment and Career Training) program is to assist eligible teens in acquiring their high school diploma or GED.

Eligibility

Expectant or parenting teens up to the age of 22 who have not received a high school diploma or GED are eligible for Project ELECT services.
