Family Support services are based in the community, serve the entire family without eligibility requirements and are voluntary.

Family Centers help families access a broad array of supports and services, including formal supports (such as home visits and parenting classes), informal supports (such as providing resources and connecting families to services in the communities), and a community system of services that promote the well-being of families and their children. Such services can take many different forms depending on the strengths and needs of the family, but their overarching goal is to help parents or caregivers enhance skills and resolve problems to promote optimal child development.
