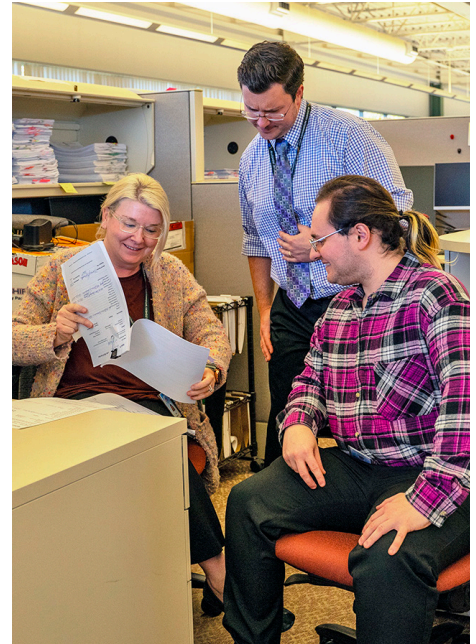




ACCESS to Reimbursement

Save administrative time and effort



SBAP allows school districts to gain partial reimbursement for health-related services for students who are eligible for Medicaid. These health services can include:

- Audiology Services
- Hearing-Impaired Services
- Nursing Services
- Nurse Practitioner Services
- Occupational Therapy Services
- Orientation, Mobility and Vision Services
- Personal Care Services
- Physical Therapy Services
- Physician Services
- Psychiatric Services
- Psychological Services
- Social Work and Counseling Services
- Special Transportation Services
- Speech and Language Services

IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS ACROSS PENNSYLVANIA, budgets are stretched and administrative time is tight. The AIU's School-Based ACCESS Program (SBAP) assists with all compliance requirements while providing nuanced expertise to aid districts in capturing their maximum potential reimbursement.

The AIU's implementation of the ACCESS Program includes:

- Access to specialized staff and a direct point of contact
- Compliance monitoring and technical assistance with audits
- Obtaining medical authorization for services
- Program updates and consultation to maximize reimbursement
- Six-year record retention
- Student medical assistance eligibility checks
- Student, provider, service and IEP data upload to MAXcapture
- Submission of quarterly participant lists and calendar to SSG
- Submission of Special Transportation
- Training materials for providers
